As a village community we will be supporting this initiative by planting 7 native trees as a Jubilee copse in the ICE field. Terence Faulkner will be planting trees around Isfield including a Jubilee Oak opposite the Isfield sign. All the trees will be registered on the official Jubilee tree canopy map.

TREASURE HUNT

From 12 noon Thurs 2nd until 2pm Sun 5th June.

Collect your information pack from 12pm Thursday, punch card, map and first clue from the **Laughing Fish Pub**.

It is a fun walk round the village, approx. 2 miles long, looking for each "Treasure Box" which will then give you the clue for the whereabouts for the next one. In each box there is also a unique hole punch so you can mark your card in the correct order. In all it will take approximately 1 - 2 hours to complete (but could be done much more quickly if you get the clues straight away, find the boxes immediately and walk at speed!). You can however take as long as you like and split it up to be done over the 4 days.

Please return your completed cards to the TWIG cake stall at the fete on Sunday 5th June by 2:00pm. If you cannot do this then please drop your cards back at the Laughing Fish by 10:00pm on Saturday 4th June.

There will be some small prizes, but it is mostly about taking part and having fun roaming round the Village solving the clues and looking for the "Treasure". All correctly punched cards will be placed in a hat and the first 3 drawn will get a prize. This will be done at the fete on the Sunday, at approximately 4pm.

There will be 2 more clues for the extra keen amongst you. These will add another 1.5 miles onto the route. There will be some walking along the road, so may not be suitable for young children. This addition is only for fun, there will be no extra prizes for completing this.
